Red Wines

Old Blocks Pinotage 2009

£16.95

South Africa

A lovely example of South Africa's best known generic variety (Pinot Noir/Cinsaut). A robustly fruity wine from South Africa – absolutely nothing to do with tobacco! Super value this one!

Montepulciano d'Abruzzo 2008

£15.95

Marchesini, Italy

Superb value here. Deep, roasted red pepper hue. Has soft cherry fruit flavours with a striking, and typically Italian, 'grilled' note. The structure is rounded but not fat, and neat finishing. To go with meats and cheeses of all persuasions.

Beaujolais Villages, Emeringes, Morel 2009

£23.95

Morel, France

The Emeringes commune is renowned for the fruitiness and generosity of its wines. Brilliant light cherry red, clean, fresh, fruity, aromas of red fruit, strawberries and cherries, served lightly chilled and wonderful with fish – please request if you would like this one chilled otherwise it is served at room temperature.

Terrace View Cabernet Merlot 2006

£18.75

Hawkes Bay, New Zealand

Soft round and fruity, a blend of three varieties from Hawkes Bay in New Zealand, very easy to drink – this one will catch up with you. NZ wines are becoming increasingly expensive but this one is a reasonable gem!

Cote du Rhone, Bouquet des Garrigues (2007)

£30.00

Clos du Caillou, France

Chateauneuf-du-Pape in all but name. When the appellation was first classified in the 1930's the then proprietor was not interested, hence this is an appellation which

is surrounded, but is not part of! Full bodied wine with hedgerow fruit and herbs in generous amounts.

Stonemason Shiraz (Ballast Stone) 2008

£21.50

McClaren Vale and Currency Creek, Australia

A Decanter award winner. This is a richly plummy, Violet wine with a good spicy character. Matured in French and US Oak for 12 months, great complexity and strength.

Rioja Crianza, Bodegas LAN 2006

£22.95

Northern Spain

One of the leading estates in Rioja, Bodegas Lan make outstanding, barrel aged wines of great concentration and depth. Fermented in stainless steel followed by at least 12 months in oak, cherry red in colour with hints of new leather and tobacco on the bouquet, quite spicy with soft berry fruit flavours. You will recognise this wine if you have visited Northern Spain.

Onyx Shiraz 2005

£19.95

Groenekloof, South Africa

An interesting wine from the Groenekloof region of South Africa. Abe Beukes is a very innovative winemaker and his shiraz is a very high quality wine. Rich, full flavoured character yet elegant with a long finish.

Malbec, Luigi Bosca Finca La Linda 2008

£16.50

Mendoza, Argentina

Argentina's trademark grape variety, although originally known in the south of France especially for 'Cahors'. Characteristically intense red colour and aromas of cherries, aged in French oak for 3 months. Great structure, fine and approachable, perfect with a steak or Chef Paul's more robust dishes.

Pinot Noir, Domaine Cabrials 2009

£17.95

Languedoc, France

With the perfect terroir for the classic grape varieties which Bernard Julian decided to plant in the Languedoc. This domaine is going from strength to strength. Soft red cherry fruit and hints of spice make this wine perfect to accompany almost anything!

White Wines

Picpoul de Pinet Domaine de Guillemarine 2009 £17.95

France

Dom. De Guillemarine has been in the same family for generations and has recently undergone extensive renovation. This delicious Picpoul has classic aromas of white flowers and stone fruit. The palate is crisp, refreshing and full of flavour with pear, lemon and pineapple fruits mingled with floral notes. Robin has finally fallen in love... all be it with this wine!!

Viognier, Vin de Pays d'Oc 2008 £16.95

Montagne Noire, France

This delightful Viognier is produced in the Languedoc region of Southern France. Fantastic growing conditions and liberal use of the new world, as well as French, winemakers produce this wine which is full of lime, apricot and peach flavours. Fairly 'medium' to the palate.

Torrentes, Finca La Linda 2008 £18.50

Cafayate, Argentina

From Cafayate in northern Argentina 1700 metres above sea level. Blessed with the constant irrigation from the mighty Andes this wine has peaches and fresh flower blossom leaping from the glass, drinks well with or without food. Girls will love this one as well as those men in touch with their feminine side.

Sauvignon Blanc, Wild South, Marlborough 2008 £22.95

Cairnbrae, New Zealand

'Best Marlborough Sauvignon' award, 'International wine of the year....' Decanter Magazine! This multi award winning wine shows a classic lychee and gooseberry nose, with hints of tropical fruits on the palate. Stunning! And a female grower – we love a bit of girl power at Dish! If I didn't drink bubbles this is my favourite...

Chablis, Domaine Savary 2008 £24.00

Maligny France

Oliver Savary is based in Maligny. His style shows the classic wet stone delicacies with hints of lemon and grapefruit on the bouquet. Perfect balance and with complexity, this is just the thing with anything fishy..... and a true classic that simply has to be part of the list.

Sancerre 2008 Clos des Bouffants £26.50

Domaine du Colombier

The wine of Sancerre can vary enormously in quality, but this brilliant Sauvignon Blanc from Roger Neveu is everything one would expect, clean, crisp and rich with good balancing acidity.

Miudino Albarino 2008/09 Rias Baixas £22.95

North East Spain

From a small DO in north east of Spain, this lovely Medal winning wine from Bodegas Gallegas is dry yet fruity and ideal with all forms of shellfish – a speciality of the region and a great replacement for the Rioja Blanco which was a hard act to follow. This was drinking beautifully at David's recent Tapas evening.

Gran Verano Chardonnay 2009 £19.95

Chile

This exceptional estate bottled Chardonnay is produced using the best grapes. Rich, tropical Chardonnay fruit, backed up by fresh acidity and a nutty complexity. An in your face style Chile white. – slightly wooded with a creamy texture.

Gavi del Comune di Gavi 2008 £26.00

Piemonte, Italy

Made from the Cortese grape in Piemonte (the home of Italy's great reds including Barolo) a dry full wine that is very much in fashion right now – maybe it's going to steal the Pinot Grigio crown – it should and I hope it does as I cannot stand Pinot Grigio!
